



New waterline construction starting as early as March 19

As early as March 19, Westminster utility crews will install a new waterline west of Simms Street on the southern edge of Meadow View Estates.

Additional waterline work along Tabor St. and W. 106th Pl. may take place to support connecting the new waterlines.

This new waterline connection will improve water service reliability for the neighborhood. Work is anticipated to last approximately four months, pending weather. We appreciate your understanding.

What to Expect

- Crews will be installing four new segments of waterline to support the Meadow View Estates community and repairing a fire hydrant.
- A section of the Willow Trail will be closed during construction.
- Work is anticipated to last up to four months, weather-dependent.
- Crews will cover or fill in the waterline trench at the end of each workday.
- Typical work hours are from 7 am to 4 pm.
- Noise, dust, backup alarms, and vibrations as crews work to excavate and install the new water line.
- Driveways and intersections may be temporarily impacted. Crews will work with homeowners to accommodate traffic as best as possible.



Work will be completed in five phases

- **Phase 1:** East waterline segment
 - Work will take approximately 3 to 4 weeks
- **Phase 2:** Tabor Court segment
 - Work will take approximately 3 to 4 weeks
- **Phase 3:** 106th Place segment
 - Work will take approximately 2 to 3 weeks
- **Phase 4:** Fire hydrant repairs at W. 107th Ave.
 - Work will take approximately 1 day
- **Phase 5:** West waterline segment
 - Work will take approximately 2 to 3 weeks

*Construction is weather dependent, and subject to change

Meadow View Estate Residents

Temporary water shut-offs are expected as we connect the new water lines. Customers will be notified 48 hrs in advance of this work. Water shut-offs typically last 4 to 6 hours.

Once water is restored, please run cold water through the largest faucet in your home, like a bathtub or utility sink, for 5 minutes. This ensures air and debris have cleared your pipes after connecting the new waterline.

You will be notified by crews before water is turned off.
