ABOUT

As part of the administration of the 2020 Community Survey, the City of Westminster conducted a mailed survey of 4,000 residents. Surveys were mailed to randomly selected households in January 2020 and data were collected over the next six weeks. After the official data collection period was underway (see the report, *2020 Community Survey Report of Results*), the City made available a web-based survey to its residents through a link on the City's website, Facebook, Nextdoor and other media. Visitors to the site were able to complete the survey during February and March and 382 surveys were received.

This report contains the results of this administration of the web-based survey that have not been weighted to current population estimates of Westminster.

COMPLETE SET OF SURVEY RESPONSES

The following pages contain a complete set of responses to each question on the survey. The percent of respondents giving a particular response is shown followed by the number of respondents. When a question includes a “don’t know” response option, the first table displays the results excluding the “don’t know” responses and the second table displays the results with the “don’t know.”

The private pay facilities are out of many families budgets and the problem is only going to worsen. Each day in the US, 10,000 people turn 60. Those individuals will require secured memory care facilities of which the only one at this point is Broomfield Skilled Nursing...in Broomfield.

- Extend the length of left turn lights at major intersections such as 92nd and Wadsworth during rush hour.
- Do something about the series of car break-ins and thefts occurring at the Westminster Open Space, Stanley Lake, etc."

- There is a large economic diversity among areas of Westminster - continue to provide equitable resources across the range.
- There needs to be mandatory recycling. And, more information as to what can be recycled, etc. There needs to be a \$1 charge for plastic bags. People need to buy their own. They're super cheap.
- There needs to be something done for the homeless. We have libraries that we can not take our children to because there are drug needles on the ground. Its like the library promotes having the homeless stay around with the laundry trucks, showers and services they provide for them. Which I agree with the services but not at a library where children can pick something up and get hurt. So why have a library turn it into a homeless shelter.
- There seems to be a lopsided focus towards the downtown and south Westminster in recent years.

My kids have no options for organized activities and spaces up here other than maybe soccer or baseball. That's why I answered it as poorly as I did because I can't use Westminster rec services or libraries.
- This isn't the single most important thing, but the city needs to provide their own broadband internet service because Comcast has a monopoly and it is too expensive!!!
- This survey is great for north Westminster. I live in south Westminster. Can you tell?? We don't matter down here.
- Ticket car & motorcycles with ear piercing noise. Install red light cameras. I'm tired of drivers running red lights. Ticket people that drive aggressively especially those who weave in & out.
- To provide public lands and maintain healthy outdoor environments that seek to be good environmental stewards for this and future generations. Open spaces are extremely important to mental health well being as well as healthy learning and social environments for children.
- To work hard and carefully at balancing the importance of new development with negative traffic impact and negative impact to open spaces. Too much traffic impacts the feeling of being able to move freely through our city and gives a frustrating feeling of a log-jam. The open spaces allow for people to find some relief from the intensities of life and to get refreshed in their minds, body, and spirit.
- Too much commercial and residential development is overtaking city infrastructure - roads, sewer, water, etc.

I pay 2/3rds of my reasonable income just to keep our house and pay basic utilities. And we didn't buy a big house, we have 5 people living in 984 sq ft.

- Wake up! The 4 day work week is selfish to the community & sure its the lazy ass employees that do not want to go back to 5 day normal work week. Its anti business also.
- Wake up. Humble yourselves. You can't solve all of the community problems. Some of these issues listed are individual problems - not government problems. By attempting to solve problems that individuals should solve on their own, such as high cost of living, you are creating more problems for the rest of the community, with increased taxes to pay for subsidized housing, plus increases in services. Then when some of us individuals come up with a solution, such as having our parents or grown children live with us, we are penalized because we are using more water than you think a single household should use.

- Westminster is a really good place to live. My two biggest suggestions in light of the changing world we live in, (1) create, encourage, and enlist public transport to the largest degree possible and encourage residents to use their cars in declining amounts: (2) Establish and expand sensible recycling so that residents know where to bring things such as used batteries and other not regularly picked up items. Even if they don't completely recycle, it would be easier to get rid of them if they were all the same thing. Back in the 80's in Illinois we had several bins for recycling, paper and cardboard in one, glass and cans in another, and plastic by itself, that sort of helped out the recycling companies. I've never seen it done like that any other place, but I think it makes the most sense.
- Westminster needs more undeveloped, natural land and permeable, soft surface trails. The development of open spaces is negatively impacting the livability of Westminster.
- Westminster needs to do a better job in planning equally for the city. If you put all the affordable housing in Southern Westminster, you create an economically depressed area. This affects, not only home values, but creates neighborhoods with less diversity. There are almost no children in my neighborhood because Westminster schools have a poor reputation. Cramming in a lot of homes into this space is not going to improve the neighborhood. We have something that no other city has. It is a gem and once it is gone, it is lost forever. It seems we could use this space for a Sports Complex/Park, like they have in Northglenn. This would keep the sight lines open to the mountains, yet bring economic growth to a community that desperately needs it. Both Thornton and Northglenn have these kinds of parks/complexes. That is what draws families to them. If you want to be progressive then we these parks/communities in Southern Westminster. If you bring families back to this part of town, you will improve the diversity and demographics of the schools.
