



New waterline construction starting as early as August 4

As early as August 4, Westminster utility crews will install a new reclaimed waterline along the Legacy Ridge loop.


This project will deliver reclaimed water to the storage pond at Legacy Ridge Golf Course and the Farmers' Highline Canal and reduces raw water consumption and ensures a reliable reclaimed water supply for irrigation, even during drought conditions.

Work is anticipated to last through September 2025, pending weather. We appreciate your understanding.

What to Expect

- A temporary traffic signal will help allow traffic to move in each direction until the project is complete.
- Please expect traffic backups and plan for extra time as the signal rotates.
- Work is anticipated to last through September 2025, weather-dependent.
- Crews will cover or fill in the waterline trench at the end of each workday.
- Typical work hours are from 7 am to 4 pm.
- Noise, dust, backup alarms, and vibrations as crews work to excavate and install the new water line.



Map Key

The north bound lane of Legacy Ridge Parkway will be closed during construction. Two temporary traffic lights will be installed to direct traffic through the south bound lane in both directions. Please allow for extra travel time.

Traffic lights will move as work progresses.

Legacy Ridge Loop Residents
