Summary Statement

The first 2014 Teams in Action luncheon was held on Wednesday, March 12, 2014, at City Park Recreation Center. The Employee Recognition Program is an integral part of the organization's efforts to provide a quality work environment by recognizing effective employees delivering quality service to citizens. This report is a summary of all March Teams in Action department submittals.

Background Information

A basic tenet of modern personnel management strategy is to consistently, diligently and honestly recognize the valuable contributions of employees. Recognition can take many forms and it is the City's intent to utilize various awards systems to acknowledge the valuable contributions made by City employees. One form of recognition that occurs twice a year is the awarding of Teams in Action. The Teams in Action award is designed to allow each City department the ability to recognize efforts and accomplishments of various teams, task forces, or work groups that may operate intra or interdepartmentally. The goal of the award is to encourage teamwork and recognize team accomplishments in the areas of quality service delivery, enhanced productivity, systems and procedures improvement and quality of work life enhancements.

The following are summaries of the Teams in Action award submittals made by departments:

City Attorney's Office - 2013 Purchasing Policy Update Team

This team is responsible for the update of the Westminster Municipal Code Title 15 "Purchasing Procedures," Administrative Memorandum 02-09 "Authorization for Expenditures, Budget Revisions, Contracts, Change Orders, & Refunds" and Administrative Memorandum 93-4 "Guidelines for Formal Bids and Requests for Proposals." These policies establish the parameters for the purchase of goods and services, including how and when purchasing authority is delegated by Council to the City Manager for previously budgeted expenditures. In order to complete the updates, staff compiled feedback on the policies since the last update in 2002 and recommended adjustments to help clarify and streamline the purchasing procedures. Staff also sought feedback on how to improve the old policies by using focus groups of employees throughout the organization. Once the policies were

approved, the team conducted ten classes to communicate the policy changes to over 170 staff members. This team's effort created a more streamlined process for purchasing and is a great example of the City's SPIRIT values.

City Manager's Office – 2013 Business Retention Visit Program Partnership

For many years, the City's Business Retention Program has served as a critical instrument to connect with the business community. The information gleaned from this program is used to improve City services. Employees from Economic Development, the Fire Department and IT partnered with the objective of improving business retention visits by reaching a broader cross section of the business community. This group created an interface for the Fire Department to access the existing business database and track and report information from businesses. As a result, the Fire Department conducted 76 business retention visits last year while also conducting their normal inspections. These visits comprised 70% of the total business retention visits and nearly 30% of the total face-to-face Economic Development related contacts with the business community. This partnership allows the City to expand its business retention program and gather additional information about Westminster businesses. This program is a great example of providing excellent service to our business community.

Finance Department – Remote Time Entry Team

In the past, hundreds of non-benefited employees completed a paper timesheet for each pay period. Using paper timesheets for such a large number of staff was tedious and prone to errors. The Remote Time Entry Team tackled the task of switching all non-benefited employees from the paper timesheet system to an electronic time entry system. Finance, IT and PR&L staff worked together to research best practices, survey other organizations, and investigate appropriate technology. Staff eventually decided on three specific solutions that would save the City an estimated \$200,000 over a five year period. Staff worked together to make system changes, create logins, build reports and train workgroups and supervisors on the new system. The impact of the new time entry system has resulted in greater efficiency, less stress and monetary savings for the city. The team's commitment to working together in order to come up with an innovative solution is a great example of the City's SPIRIT values.

Fire Department – Connectivity Team

For several years, the Fire Department has experienced difficulty with connections to the City's IT network and internet access. It wasn't possible to resolve the various issues with one solution, and staff determined that substantial money would need to be spent in order to invest in new technology and fix the problems correctly. At Fire Station 1, staff determined that a fiber optic cable was required in order to increase connection speeds. Staff worked with vendors to get a significantly reduced price for the fiber optic cable installation, which resulted in connection speeds over 100 times faster than they had been prior to installing the cable. At Fire Station 5, a new wireless link was selected as the solution to slow connection speeds and unreliable phone service. Crews from this station helped hoist cinder blocks and antenna equipment to the roof of Station 5, saving a considerable amount of money that would have been needed for a crane. In response to the connectivity issues for mobile data terminals and field reporting tablets, staff found new technology that was able to reliably connect Fire apparatus to the internet. IT and Fire staff members were instrumental in researching, brainstorming, implementing and troubleshooting this technology. Rather than requesting additional funds to pay for these expensive upgrades, staff reallocated existing CIP funds to pay for the project. This was a tremendous collaborative effort that has resulted in quality solutions and is another great example of the City's SPIRIT values at work.

General Service Department – 2014 Employee Winter Escape Planning Team

This team was responsible for planning a formal holiday celebration for City employees. The team created an interactive and entertaining theme in which employees could move around and talk while enjoying a host of activities. Staff selected a cruise ship theme and the creative juices began to flow! Ports of call with food representative of the country along with dancing, dueling pianos for entertainment, a photo booth and no stakes gambling were offered to those who boarded the ship on the gang way built by Fleet and Building Operations staff. A marketing tag line, marketing materials, boarding passes and decorations were created. Even Brent McFall got in on the fun and allowed the group to create "Captain Brent", who managed to show up at a variety of meetings and at the event. Despite a date change and location change that came up unexpectedly during the course of the planning, this team kept a positive, can-do attitude. Feedback from those in attendance was extremely positive and the event was a huge success. This team created a memorable experience for City employees that they will remember for years to come.

Information Technology Department – COWnet Design Team

This team of employees from Information Technology and the Public Information Office is responsible for completely redesigning the City's intranet. By incorporating international best practices and engaging users throughout the process, this team created a more intuitive navigation system and enhanced functionality. People finding, event management, topical news feeds and even a custom links section are now available, with more improvements to come. The greatest enhancement this project delivered was the main content management system that now allows departmental representatives to directly add and maintain their own content. This team spanned more than a year and resulted in the 2014 launch of the completely redesigned intranet known as COWnet, which is a crucial tool for employees across the City to share and receive information. This team is an excellent example of SPIRIT values at work!

Parks Recreation & Libraries – Seasonal Recruitment Campaign Team

The Seasonal Recruitment Campaign Team worked together to create a new marketing campaign for seasonal employment. This team brainstormed the tag line of "This Could Be Your Office" and a strategy to reach potential employees who would be motivated and excited to work outdoors. The team created a website specifically for seasonal employment and featured on-location video testimonials from many current seasonal employees or employees that began as seasonal employees and were later promoted. Eye-catching marketing materials such as postcards, posters, tent cards and vehicle magnets featuring parks, golf, open space, pools, and camps were designed and printed to distribute throughout the community. This team's efforts helped ensure that the City fills over 200 seasonal positions a year with high-quality employees that are crucial to many of our summer programs.

Police Department – Intergraph CAD and Mobile Software Upgrade Team

This team was responsible for a major system upgrade of the Police and Fire Department's Intergraph CAD and Mobile software and consisted of employees from IT and the Police and Fire Departments. The IT team purchased, configured, and tested four new servers and workstations. During the week of cutover to production, the entire IT team was on hand to support the Police Department and Intergraph. The Police and Fire Departments made recommendations to IT staff that would produce the best interface for those using the system in the field. Staff created documentation and trained all Patrol, Fire, EMS, Animal Management and Code Enforcement staff on the new interface and were a resource for testing, communicating feedback, and balancing wants and needs. The Dispatch team made decisions on new functions and ways to enhance workflows and processes. This team also tested the system, trained their coworkers, and provided feedback to make further improvements. As

a result of this project, Westminster has become the go-to site to help other agencies transition successfully. This project was another great example of the City's SPIRIT values at work!

Public Works and Utilities Department – Street Operations and Utilities Division In-House Training Team

The Public Works & Utilities Training Team members from both Street Operations and Utilities Field Operations Divisions diligently arrange for in-house trainings presented by trained City staff or coordinated through Risk Management. The team also works with outside sources for trainings and certifications for the 58 employees within the two divisions, and occasionally for staff in other City departments including BO&M, Fleet, Parks and Fire when trainings are pertinent to their operations. These arrangements require balancing and rearranging workloads and schedules when necessary. The trainings and certifications provide safety and operational procedures with customized training. They also teach pertinent processes and help protect field personnel in a variety of work situations while providing excellent customer service and cost savings to the City.

Recognizing teams is an important management practice in organizations striving to develop loyalty, ownership and effectiveness in their most valuable resource – employees. Westminster's employee recognition program, which includes the Teams in Action award, supports City Council's Strategic Plan goal of a "Financially Sustainable City Government Providing Exceptional Services" by maintaining a value driven organization and enhancing employee morale.

Summary Statement

This report is for City Council information only and requires no action by City Council.

- This report provides the City Council with a summary of administratively approved projects processed between January and December 2013, since not all projects approved by the City require a public hearing and Planning Commission or City Council review.
- The Westminster Municipal Code subsections 11-5-9(B) and 11-5-10(B) require that a report be provided to the City Council of which describes administratively approved Preliminary and Official Development Plans (PDPs and ODPs).
- Staff also reports some of this information as specific projects are approved throughout the year in the City's Weekly Edition. However, this report summarizes the development projects approved during January through December, 2013.

Background Information

The Municipal Code allows the approval, by the City Manager or designee, of developments that are 10 acres or smaller without public hearings. This administrative approval eligibility does not include any Preliminary or Official Development Plans on a site larger than 10 acres (up to 20 acres for a project the City Council determines to be an economic development project), or any Official Development Plan amendment changing any zoning standard by more than 10% over the existing requirement. Notwithstanding any of the above, if neighborhood controversy arises during the development review process, projects are scheduled for the Planning Commission by the staff, even if they are eligible for administrative approval. As previously referenced, the Municipal Code requires that a report be provided to the City Council that describes administratively approved PDPs and ODPs.

In addition to the municipal code requirements to report on administratively approved Preliminary Development Plans and Official Development Plans, the Planning Division tracks activity levels in various areas and for performance measures. A list of the projects that were administratively approved is outlined in the attached table.

Highlights of 2013 Planning Division activities are summarized below:

- A total of 79 Official Development Plan Amendments, Official Development Plan Waivers and Preliminary Development Plan Amendments were approved administratively in 2013. This represents a 21.8% decrease over approvals in 2012 (79 v. 101).
- In 2013, staff held 263 informational meetings with customers interested in developing projects within the City. This is a 10.5% increase over 2012 (263 v. 238).
- The number of customer inquiries between January and December 2013 was 10,513. This includes 1,023 walk-ins and 9,460 phone and e-mail requests. This is a 5.5% increase over 2012 (10,513 v. 9,966).
- For 2013, 562 business licenses were processed, which is a 48.3% increase over the activity in 2012 (562 v. 379).

The work the Planning Division performs supports all five of the City Council's goals of Financially Sustainable City Government Providing Exceptional Services; Safe and Secure Community; Strong, Balanced Local Economy; Vibrant Neighborhoods in One Livable Community; and Beautiful and Environmentally Sensitive City.
