### **Summary Statement:**

This report is for City Council information only and requires no action by City Council.

- The following report updates 2011 residential development activity per subdivision (please see attachment) and compares 2011 year-to-date totals with 2010 year-to-date totals.
- The table below shows an overall increase (188.5%) in new residential construction for 2011 year-to-date when compared to 2010 year-to-date totals (378 units in 2011 vs. 131 units in 2010).
- Residential development activity for the month of October 2011 versus October 2010 reflects a decrease in single-family detached (5 units in 2011 versus 6 units in 2010), and no change in single-family attached, multiple family, or senior housing (0 units in both years).

SUBJECT: Recreation Facility 2012 Fees and Operational Changes

## Summary Statement:

This report is for City Council information only and requires no formal action by City Council.

In an effort to meet both community needs and City Council's Strategic Plan Goals, Staff is implementing the below-listed adjustments to admission fees, facility passes and the implementation of reduced fees for Westminster-based businesses.

- In July of 2000, City Council adopted Resolution No. 55, which grants the City Manager authority to make annual adjustments to recreation center daily admission fees up to 25 cents and annual passes up to \$30. Staff's proposed 2012 fees are within the City Manager's authority to increase or make adjustments to existing, approved fee structures.
- The City Manager and Parks, Recreation and Libraries Staff have reviewed usage statistics, budgets, and fee survey information. Unless Councillors wish to discuss specific points of this report, the City Manager has authorized Staff to implement these fees effective January 1, 2012. (See attached chart for proposed pass fees)
- The proposed changes are consistent with City Council's and Staff's philosophy of increasing fees in small increments rather than waiting several years and initiating larger increases.
- The MAC is jointly owned and operated by the City and Hyland Hills Park and Recreation District. Both parties must approve the fees prior to implementation of fee changes at The MAC only.



### **Background Information:**

- Staff's philosophy on fees and charges is to maximize cost recovery while providing affordable facilities and programs for the City's residents. The changes recommended reflect this philosophy while indicating sensitivity to the current economic challenges.
- Staff is recommending an increase of 25 cents per visit to the adult (ages 21- 59) admission fees at The MAC. The current admission fee for adults (21-59) is \$2.50 with a Resident Discount Card or \$3.50 for all others. This proposed admission fee increase will keep The MAC aligned with other adult recreation centers in the surrounding communities while not impacting the senior rate. The adult admission fee is lower than the City's other recreation center fees due to fewer amenities offered at The MAC. Punch card fees are directly related to admission fees and will be adjusted accordingly. Based on the average number of year-to-date admissions in 2011, Staff estimates a nominal increase in revenue collected for 2012 of approximately \$300.
- Staff is recommending including a monthly pass option for youth at the City's four recreation centers (excludes The MAC). This pass type has been very well utilized in the adult and senior categories and Staff would like to extend this option to the youth in our community.
- Staff is recommending the implementation of a business wellness program. This program provides City of Westminster based businesses the opportunity to purchase prepaid admissions for their employees at a volume discount. This discount would equate to a resident punch card rate. This program would compliment the existing business pass option that provides City of Westminster business employees the opportunity to purchase an ID card that gives them resident rates.
- In addition to the existing household pass fee structure, which focuses on both youth and adult participation, Staff is recommending the addition of an adult household "duo pass" option for two adults living in the same household (See attached chart) at the City's four recreation centers (excludes The MAC). This proposed pass type will keep the City's four recreation centers competitively aligned with other recreation centers in the surrounding communities. This has been a frequent request at the City Park Fitness Center where youth participation is not an option and the household pass is not as viable of an option.
- Staff is recommending the addition of a "City Park Complex" admission/ punch visit upgrade that would allow guests to purchase a \$2.00 add-on to either their daily admission or punch pass visit. This upgrade would allow guests to use both facilities in one visit (must be during the same day). Due to City Park Recreation and Fitness Center's proximity, guests frequently request to use both facilities in one visit. In order to do this, guests are required to pay two



admission fees. Due to the expense, guests rarely choose this option. Staff foresees that providing this option would improve guest service and add an additional revenue source.

These fee changes meet the City's Strategic Plan Goal of "Financially Sustainable City Government Providing Exceptional Services."

### **Summary Statement:**

- This report is for City Council information only and requires no action by City Council.
- The attached document is a listing of all 2011 City Council posted expenditures from July 1 through September 30, 2011.



### **Background Information:**

The following report is a listing of City Council expenditures by each account for July 1 through September 30 as posted by October 6, 2011. <u>As of September 30, 2011, 75% of the year elapsed and Council spent approximately 60%, or \$144,184 of its amended 2011 budget.</u> City Council's adopted 2011 budget totals \$240,119.

City Council acquired iPads in July as a replacement technology for separate laptops and paper packets. The expense associated with the iPad purchase has been charged to the GCORF PC Replacement account as previously discussed. Accessories associated with the iPads have been charged to City Council's supplies account and reflected in the attached document. The iTunes cards noted in the supplies account were utilized for Council to acquire the various City identified app's needed to review Council Meeting packets and for other Council business.

As of September 30, some of the expenses associated with Council's attendance at the Colorado Municipal League's (CML) annual conference in June have not been reconciled in JDE. The expenses associated with Councillors Briggs, Lindsey, and Mayor McNally's attendance at CML have not been posted to the career development account. Current estimates for the conference are as follows: Briggs (\$890.85), Lindsey (\$1,196.00, which includes lodging expenses for Lindsey, McNally, and Winter), and McNally (\$302.00). Staff anticipates having these expenses posted in JDE prior to the next expenditure report.
