New Bike Lanes to be added along Simms Street



The city maintains 1,135 miles of streets to support the quality of life of residents, support the local economy and reduce long-term costs. Simms St. is being resurfaced in 2020 to provide a smooth driving surface.

As part of this work, the city's Bicycle Master Plan and the current development of the Transportation & Mobility Plan, new bike facilities will be added to Simms St. between 100th Ave and Westmoor Dr. at the end of July or early August:

The bike lanes provide a safer and more connected option for bicyclists traveling between neighborhoods and trails and to other destinations, as well as increase driver awareness of bicyclists traveling along the street.

To ensure the safety of bicyclists and drivers, drivers are required by law to maintain a minimum 3-foot buffer when passing a bicyclist.

In addition to the new bike lanes:

- Left turn lanes will be added to southbound Simms St. to provide access to 105th Dr., 103rd Ave., and 101st Ave.
- All existing right turn lanes along the corridor will remain.
