

21. In common areas, use lighting controls such as occupancy sensors, bypass/delay timers, photocells or time clocks.

Occupancy sensors installed in common areas, such as bathrooms, break rooms, offices, storage closets, and meeting rooms, are a great way to save energy by automatically turning lights off when the area is not in use and can save 15-25% of the energy used by the controlled fixtures. Installing sensors that either dim or turn off lights in areas that get sufficient daylight can reduce energy usage with minimal noticeable impact.
