6. Complete regularly scheduled maintenance on your HVAC (heating, ventilation and air conditioning) systems at least twice a year.	HELP

Maintenance includes cleaning or replacing filters on heating and air-conditioning units, cleaning air-
conditioning condenser coils, and maintaining proper function of economizers on air-conditioning units.
Without regular maintenance the efficiency of HVAC systems deteriorates over time and useful life can
be shortened. Airflow problems from dirty AC coils can reduce the unit's efficiency by up to 15%.

Tenants and property managers have options for greening their space using a green building rating system for existing buildings, such as LEED for Interior Design and Construction, LEED for Building Operations and Maintenance, or EnergyStar.

14. Install low-emissivity coatings on windows.

Window film is a low-cost way to reduce solar heat gain from large windows, increasing occupant comfort and lowering summertime cooling bills.

15. Purchase renewable energy credits or subscribe to a community renewable energy program to meet at least 10% of your energy needs.

#### Equipment and installation costs for solar energy continue to fall. Solar panels can be installed on-site or purchased through an off-site community solar program. Check with your Green Business Advisor for details about current incentives.

16. Check for and seal air leaks in exterior walls, doors, and windows.

Air sealing is one of the most cost-effective efficiency measures. Even an eighth-of-an-inch gap around a door amounts to the same area as a two-and-a-half-inch hole in the wall.

17. Insulate all exposed hot water piping.

Pipe insulation improves efficiency of your water heating system, can reduce burn time and may allow you to lower your set point temperature.

18. Install a high-efficiency heating system.

Gas furnaces and boilers that are at least 92% AFUE, heat pumps are at least 15 SEER

19. Replace all fluorescent lighting with LEDs.

Replace T12 or T8 fixtures with LED troffer fixtures, which can provide superior lighting quality, dim better than fluorescents, work better with occupancy sensors, last longer, and use 40-60% less energy than T12s.

20. In common areas, use lighting controls such as occupancy sensors, bypass/delay timers, photocells or time clocks.

Occupancy sensors installed in common areas, such as bathrooms, break rooms, offices, storage closets, and meeting rooms, are a great way to save energy by automatically turning lights off when the area is not in use and can save 15-25% of the energy used by the controlled fixtures. Installing sensors that either dim or turn off lights in areas that get sufficient daylight can reduce energy usage with minimal noticeable impact.

Installed high efficiency AC system (< 5.4 tons minimum 17 SEER; 5.5-20 tons minimum 12 EER), evaporative cooler(s), or evaporative AC pre-cooling.

22. Install high-efficiency water heaters.

High-efficiency storage hot water heaters can save 10-20% on energy versus the minimum standard. Tankless water heaters can save 45-60% on energy, where appropriate. Heat pumps can save 65% compared to electric heaters.

23. Replace all exterior lighting, including parking lighting, with LEDs.

Using LEDs for exterior lighting will reduce the energy used for the lighting and provide better lighting for your property.

## Did Waste

### CORE MEASURES

1. Provide waste diversion training for employees at least once every three years.

Your expert Green Business Advisor can teach your employees about composting and recycling, why it is important, and how to participate effectively. To keep diversion high, include zero waste trainings in your new employee orientation and provide refreshers at regular staff meetings.

2. Designate a recycling coordinator to take responsibility for monitoring and maintaining proper waste diversion and for conducting ongoing education.

3. Conduct a waste assessment to determine your diversion rate and identify waste reduction opportunities, within the last five years.



By setting up compost collection, you may be eligible for incentives to help offset some of the cost. A list of compost haulers for your area is provided, and it is recommended that you get 2-3 bids to ensure best pricing.
